We look forward to seeing you at our event and hope that it wets your appetites to learn more about East Anglian Traditions and Music.



Easter

I am sure we have all heard about the Taj Mahal - it was built by the Mughal emperor Shah Jahan to house the tomb of his wife and it has been declared one of the new 7 wonders of the world. We have all read about its beauty and maybe also heard from friends who have visited and seen for themselves, and of course who can forget the iconic picture of Princess Diana sitting all alone by the reflection pool just outside the tomb. So, although we had heard about the blindingly bright white marble and how it changes colour as it reflects the sun-light at different times of the day, my wife and I needed to visit and to see and touch this for ourselves. So, many years ago, we visited the Taj Mahal at sunset one Easter Saturday and returned very early the next morning on Easter day, just before dawn to witness the sunrise.

This April in our church calendar, we celebrate the Easter story of the life, crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The bible tells us about the events that took place on that Easter morning, 3 days after his crucifixion on Good Friday. We can read about Mary Magdalene, and how she was alone in the garden weeping in search of Jesus; what a picture that would have made - indeed there are many beautiful paintings of this. We hear too about how the angels appeared in shining bright white clothes and we read about those who rushed to the tomb and witnessed first-hand the risen Lord who appeared to them. Finally, we hear about those who doubted and wanted to go and see for themselves and so we read the story of doubting Thomas who only believed once he had seen and touched the scars in Jesus' hands and feet. The phrase 'doubting Thomas' is one that is still used regularly to this day.

So, coming back to the Taj Mahal on that Easter Sunday morning when I visited... some people had left it too late and as they came rushing in they shouted are we too late? Has the sun risen? To which I replied, He has risen indeed, alleluia.

With Spring on its way, what better time to launch an exciting opportunity for Yaxley?

Fit Villages is a well-established and popular project that brings our community together to socialise, have fun and become more active. The project is supported by Suffolk County Council and helps villages in rural locations to set up fun activity sessions for adults aged over 55. Previously popular activities have included chair-based exercise, yoga, Pilates, keep fit, dance and low impact circuits, but we are open to new ideas and welcome your suggestions.

We need your input to identify the sort of physical activity session that would be of interest to you, what day would be most suitable and what time would be preferable.

Project officers then help to source quality local instructors, provide funding towards instructor costs, village hall hire fees, equipment costs, launching the activities, and providing refreshments.

Activities are subsidised for the first 8 weeks, after which 96% of projects become sustainable on their own and continue to run long term.

VOTER ID

From 4 May 2023, voters in England will need to show photo ID to vote at polling stations in some elections.

This will apply to

- Local elections;
- Police and Crime Commissioner elections;
- UK parliamentary by-elections;
- Recall petitions
- From October 2023 it will also apply to UK General elections.

Accepted voter ID includes:

- Passport issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or a Commonwealth country
- Driving licence issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, or an EEA state (this includes a provisional driving licence)
- A Blue Badge
- Older Person's Bus Pass
- Disabled Person's Bus Pass

If you don't have accepted photo ID, you can apply for a free voter ID document, which is known as a **Voter Authority Certificate.**

I ordered a watch online for my partner's birthday. The company has since gone out of business. I keep phoning and emailing them but can't get through to anyone. If they don't send the watch, what should I do?

If the company has gone into administration, it may still be able to fulfil outstanding orders, but if the company is already in liquidation, you'll need to try to get your money back. If you're unsure about what state the company is in, the Citizens Advice website has information on how to find out.

As the company hasn't responded to your calls or emails, is there a shop or office you can visit or write to, to get an update on your order or request a refund? If that isn't possible, the next steps depend on whether it's a limited company (it will have ltd or plc after its title) or if it's a sole trader (someone who runs their own business) or partnership.

If it's a limited company, you'll need to get details of the administrator or receiver - the person dealing with settling the trader's debts. The names of those administrators will usually be on the website of the company that's gone bust. You should register your claim as a creditor on the GOV.UK website. Fill out the form with details of what you're owed and send it to the administrator dealing with the trader's debts. Unfortunately, there's only a small chance you'll receive any money back because you'll be last in a long list of creditors who need to be paid.

If you paid by credit card, you could also try getting your money back with a Section 75 claim to your card provider or bank. Full details about both these types of claims can be found on the Citizens Advice website. If the seller was a sole trader or partnership and not a limited company, pursuing a Section 75 is your best option.

Every case is different when traders go under, but you can call the Citizens Advice consumer helpline to find out exactly what your rights are on 0808 223 1133 or visit www.citizensadvice.org.uk/consumer
