St. Mary's Church

South Hartismere Benefice March 2023

As I write this, I am enjoying seeing first signs of new growth; in many of our churchyards snowdrops are a particularly beautiful sight – so perfectly small and hopeful.

As you read this, we will be well into the season of Lent. Lent is the period of 40 days before Easter. It starts on Ash Wednesday and ends on Easter Eve. But if you look in a calendar and count the days and they come to more than 40, don't be perplexed – this is because you don't count the Sundays in Lent!

Rather like Advent, Lent is seen as a time of preparation. The church colour for both seasons is purple, which is traditionally a royal colour, helping us to remember that Jesus is King and that he died at Easter. If you go into a church doing Lent you will see that things like the altar cloth are purple to show this and when I am doing a service during Lent I will wear a purple stole.

Of course, the most popular and well known tradition during Lent is to give something up, a tradition which originated from the stricter fasting practices. Maybe you have decided to give up a luxury during Lent this year?

In my day job as a Primary Church School Headteacher we talk to the children about these things. It can be really amusing to hear them be very keen to give up their least favourite vegetable!

More and more there is a new tradition of people trying to do positive things during Lent. At my school we often participate in things such as '40 Acts of Kindness' or '40 Acts of Generosity'. It is a great way to put others first. Imagine the impact if we all tried to add in extra kindness or generosity every day.

Mothering Sunday also falls during Lent. Traditionally, in the 16th Century, this was when people were expected to visit their 'mother' church. If that was too far to travel they would go to their nearest Cathedral. Later on, it was a day when maids and servants had a day off to go back and visit their mothers and families. It can be a tough day for those of us who miss their mums. If you would like to light a candle, have a few moments of peace and quiet or join us for a Mothering Sunday Service or any other, whether it be with your family or in celebration or remembrance – you will all be very welcome.

DR DAN POULTER MP

As I write these words on a crisp January day, with the festivities seeming far behind, I'm aware the first anniversary of the invasion of Ukraine approaches, by the time you read these lines this sombre date will have just passed. Like many of you I have been reflecting on the impact this has had across our country and particularly here in Suffolk.

The tragic loss of life in Ukraine is deeply saddening and many people have been forced to flee their homes. The UK response to the crisis has been commendable, not least of all here in Suffolk where, as ever, I've been heartened by the response of our local communities.

I've seen first-hand, the compassion for Ukrainian refugees from residents across Suffolk and it is humbling to witness the way the Ukrainian families have settled into life here, with children attending schools and parents finding work. How difficult attempting a normal life in a foreign country must be, whilst worrying about loved ones forced to stay behind.

As a regular visitor to our local schools, during a recent visit I was delighted to meet with a young Ukrainian student who my parliamentary team and I assisted in settling here. The student is now thriving within the school, and I was impressed to learn how easily they had settled into school and Suffolk life, supported by staff and fellow pupils.

Perhaps the biggest impact the conflict has had for many in the UK and around the world is on the cost of living. We still find ourselves in the midst of a challenging winter as we count the cost of Putin's energy war. However, despite this, we welcome the news that in recent weeks, gas prices have thankfully stabilised and started to fall. This will help in reducing the impact of the war on the UK's inflation and cost of living for everyone.

In addition to the impact on energy supplies and prices, Putin also appears to be weaponising food supplies. Both Russia and Ukraine are among the biggest exporters of fertiliser and a further consequence of the conflict has been a reduction in supplies of fertiliser to the UK. This has increased the cost of growing food and resulting in increased prices in the shops.

We all remain concerned about what the future holds for Ukraine and hope for a resolution soon, in the meantime our continued support for the UK Government's position in standing shoulder to shoulder with Ukraine is right. I shall do everything I can to ensure the needs of Suffolk's residents and businesses are heard in Westminster during these challenging times.

Some examples:

Bury St Edmunds

An old Saxon town and parliamentary borough, situated in so healthy a spot that it has been called the Montpelier of England in a beautiful part of West Suffolk, founded by Canute along with an

abbey, to commemorate the martyrdom of Edmund, a King of East Anglia, by the Danes in the year 870.

Hadleigh

A Market town in the county of Suffolk, built on the banks of the river Breton. It was celebrated some years back for the manufacture of cloth, but the inhabitants are now principally employed in the spinning of yarn for the Norwich weavers.

Diss

The church was built by the Fitzwalters. Skelton (the witty poet laureate to Harry the Bluff) was rector. In the vicinity is Shimpling, the Duke of Grafton's seat.

I could go on...and on... No mention of Yaxley Halt, as my version predates it's construction and opening in 1922.

What do you use for?? – edging lawns / keeping tall flowers from falling over / preventing eye accidents with canes / giving ground cover in deep shade? / creating a weed barrier under paths etc

Share your knowledge and experience! - if you've gardened at all - you've got useful experience.

Bring cuttings/ saved seed – and share them around. If you save your own seed, you may have more than you can use. Don't throw them out - bring them along!

We meet on the first Thursday of the month in Yaxley Village Hall at 7.15 for 7.30 in the winter, and by arrangement for visits in the summer. We have members from Yaxley, Mellis, Thornham, Wortham, Eye – so if you live in the local area, you're welcome to join. It costs £20 per year, and we usually need to pay for garden visits.

My employer asked me to work some extra hours lately, but I don't appear to have received the extra pay. I asked my boss about it and they said they would look into it, but I don't seem to be getting anywhere. What should I do?

If you think your pay is wrong, or you haven't been paid for extra hours worked, the best thing you can do is talk to your employer and find out what's going on. If you and your employer can't agree on how much you should have been paid, you can challenge them. You should act quickly though – it'll be harder to get your money after 3 months from the date the problem arose.

You should start by checking your payslip if you've got one. This will help you see how your pay has been worked out. Check things like:

- Whether you've been paid for the number of hours you've actually worked
- If you've been paid at the correct rate
- If you've been paid overtime, a commission or a bonus
- Whether you've been paid any sick pay
- If your employer has deducted any money that you weren't expecting

Ask your employer to explain anything you don't understand on your payslip or why you haven't been paid what you believe you are owed. If you disagree with anything, explain why. If your employer has made a genuine mistake, ask them to pay you the money you're owed straight away – you should not have to wait until your next pay day.

If you need more help, you can contact Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk to get advice on the next steps.
